The Ra-Marama Community Information Hub (RMCIH) project comprises the design, construction, and landscaping of a Great Hall and associated buildings in the town of Savusavu, on the island of Vanua Levu, Fiji. Funded by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, the RMCIH is a collaborative project between the rural women of Cakaudrove—Soqosoqo Vakamarama i Taukei ni Cakaudrove (SVTC)—and Architects Without Frontiers. SVTC facilitates a range of education programs for remote communities in Cakaudrove to promote gender equality and preserve Indigenous arts, crafts, and culture. The RMCIH project will provide accommodation and community spaces for women and families to tell stories, sell craft, educate and learn.
