The district of Dien Ban in Vietnam was heavily bombed and sprayed with Agent Orange during the Vietnam War. Today the district has a chronic incidence of infant disability, which is compounded by a lack of support services for affected families. The Dien Ban Disability Day Centre was a project developed by the Kianh Foundation in 2008 to meet the urgent health, physiotherapy, and educational needs of these children. The centre currently provides integrated services to 110 children from the area whose opportunities in life would otherwise be extremely limited.
